

### **A New Public Facility**

and explain how you feel about it.

### **Notes**

- "New" can mean it was built within the past 2 or 3 years. In fact, it would be possible to describe a new facility in an old building. For example, an old building was recently converted into a cinema.

- What kind of public facility do you think people like the most?
- Who do you think uses public facilities more, old people or young

people?

- How does (or can) the government find out what the people want and need?
- Would you say facilities such as cinemas and parks are important in a (or, the) city?
- How important would you say development in the cities is?
- Do towns and villages also need facilities?
- What new facilities do you think we will see in the future?
- Which facilities in your city do you think are better, the old ones or the new ones?
- In general, are young people very willing to share facilities with old people?
- Which group of people likes going to a park more, old people or young people?
- Which would you say is more important, facilities for young people, or facilities for old people?

### **City Living**

- Would you say people in the cities are less likely to communicate with others than people in rural areas?
- Do people in the cities usually know their neighbours?
